

3M to Sponsor Todd Kluever in the Busch Series in 2006; Company Will Also Sponsor Kluever and Mark Martin in Nextel Cup

3M Company and Roush Racing announced today that 3M will be the primary sponsor for the No. 06 Ford Fusion entry driven by Todd Kluever in the 2006 NASCAR Busch Series. The season-opening February 18th race at Daytona International Speedway will mark the Busch Series debut for Kluever, the new No. 06 team under the leadership of crew chief Mike Kelley, and 3M.

Kluever was awarded his ride in the Craftsman Truck Series after winning Roush's "Gong Show" in November 2004.

Kelley, 34, has been with Roush since 2002. He previously served as car chief of the No. 97 Irwin/Sharpie Ford in the Nextel Cup Series under Jimmy Fennig, and was part of the championship team in 2004.
