

3M Files Patent Infringement Lawsuit to Protect Optically Clear Adhesive Products

3M Innovative Properties Co. and 3M Korea Ltd. filed a patent infringement lawsuit on May 4, 2015, in the Seoul Central District Court against LG Hausys Ltd.

The suit alleges that certain LG Hausys Ltd. optically clear adhesive products infringe 3M's Korean Patent No. 1,162,463 titled "Cloud Point-Resistant Adhesives and Laminates."
